Han-na Chang makes her debut with the ISO conducting three performances of Tchaikovsky's Symphony No. 5. Vadym Kholodenko, Gold Medalist at the 2013 Van Cliburn International Piano Competition, also makes his debut with Prokofiev's Third Piano Concerto.

- South Korean Han-na Chang gained international recognition in 1994 when she won both the First Prize and the Contemporary Music Prize at the Fifth Rostropovich International Cello Competition at age 11. At age 21, she was named Music Director of the Qatar Philharmonic Orchestra, a position she vacated late last year. She now holds the position of Principal Guest Conductor of the Trondheim Symphony Orchestra, where Krzysztof Urbański serves as Music Director.
- Twenty-seven-year-old Ukrainian pianist Vadym Kholodenko performed at more than 50 concerts in America alone last season as the Van Cliburn Gold Medal prize winner. He continues his international tour with his debut in Indianapolis.

The final concert of the "Fantasy, Fate and War: A Midwinter Russian Music Festival" features the ISO's first performance of Shostakovich's Symphony No. 7 ("Leningrad").

- This will be the first time the ISO has performed Shostakovich's "Leningrad" Symphony in its history.
- The Feb. 2 First Mondays at the ISO takes a look at Russian history and politics, particularly during World War II and the Siege of Leningrad, when Shostakovich wrote this gripping symphony. All First Mondays at the ISO programs begin at 7 p.m. in the Wood Room and are free and open to the public.

 On Feb. 6, the ISO and American Pianists Association will collaborate for an ISO Russian Nightcap, a special post-concert chamber music presentation at the Columbia Club featuring APA Fellow Stephen Beus.
